The Indie Arcade – hosted in the courtyard of the Smithsonian American Art Museum in collaboration with MAGFest and the American Univeristy Game Lab – was super rad for a number of reas

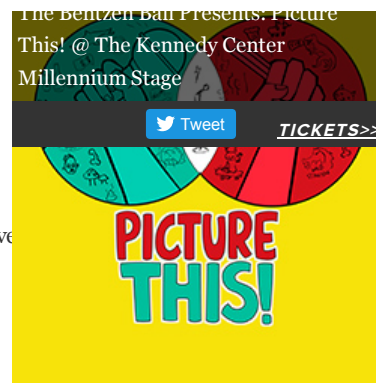
- It was completely free (unless you bought a beer or a pretty delicious sandwich from The Courtyard Cafe);
- It was intended for and attended by people of all ages; and

There were new games from local developers, classic cabinets, and even classes to learn how to create your own game.

Three classes were offered, with age ranges from 8 to adult. The first of such classes taught kids how to make a simple game using [Scratch](#), a free programming language and online community ho: the classic Pong (with free software [GameMaker](#)) and how to make 3D character and game using [Unity](#) (which also has a free version).

There were pretty, arty games like [Flower](#) – where the “character” you control is the wind; point-and-click adventure games, [Alum](#) being a nice looking example; and even a capitalist-inspired reve: up livestock with food, hormones, and antibiotics so you'll make more money and eventually overthrow the competing company.

Drawing the largest crowd was Oculus Rift – the first commercially-viable virtual reality headset. Wikipedia says the consumer version will not be available until next year, so people had the chance living vicariously through [this old lady](#) who already had the pleasure.
